Instructors with master's and/or doctoral degrees in various language-related fields, such as Korean studies and education



- Orientation for new students (dormitory, campus life, and campus facility tours)



The regular course at the Korean Language & Culture Center is designed for foreigners or overseas Koreans who want to learn Korean to enter a Korean university or graduate school or for employment after acquiring Korean proficiency.

Level		Aims and Contents
Beginning	Level 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can perform basic language functions such as self-introduction, buying things, ordering food, and understanding and expressing opinions on topics such as family, hobby and weather. • Can communicate using simple vocabulary and understanding of basic grammar. Additionally, can understand practical sentences and use everyday expressions.
	Level 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can perform telephone conversation, asking for a favor, using facilities such as post office, bank and others. • Can understand and use paragraphs on private and familiar topics. • Can distinguish expression between formal and informal situations.
Intermediate	Level 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do not feel any difficulty in daily life, and can use the basic language to use various public facilities and maintain social relation. • Can express or understand familiar social topics in a paragraph. • Can understand and use the basic characteristics of written and spoken language.
	Level 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can use the language for the public facilities and social relation, as well as general work performance. • Most general social topics of news and newspaper articles can be understood and used. • Possible to understand and use socio-cultural contents based on the common idiomatic expressions and understanding representative Korean culture.
Advanced	Level 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhances advanced expressions and comprehension skills based on what has been learned in elementary and intermediate classes. • Possible to appropriately classify the language according to the situation-formal and informal as well as spoken and written context.
	Level 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Based on the language skills, he/she can logically communicate and fluently express his/her ideas for research of work in the specialized field. A learner can understand and discuss academic and specific topics such as politics, economy, society and culture. • Can understand and discuss academic and specific topics such as political, economic, social and cultural. • Though not having reached the level of native speakers, a learner does not have difficulty performing linguistic functions or expressing opinions.

3	A copy of passport	① a copy of passport * Passport validity must remain 2-3 years ② a copy of one's ID card
4	Bank statement	① A minimum balance of USD \$8,000 Bank statements must be issued within one month
5	Certificate of final graduation	① Apostille countries : Apostille certificate with English translation ② Non Apostille countries : Certified by Korean consulate
6	Certificate of final academic transcript	* If the original document is not English, submit additional translation publication copy
7	Birth certificate/ family register(relation) certificate	① Family relationship certificate or birth certificate * For Chinese students, submit the family register ② Parental employment and income certificate ③ A copy of your parent's ID (or a copy of passport)

6 Notes

- Prepare the necessary documents for evaluation and submit them by mail.
- A student can personally apply for and obtain a visa(D-4) at the Korean Consulate with the required documents. (Please check the documents required for visa issuance before applying).
- Register according to the enrollment instructions sent with the admission letter.
- If false information is provided, admission will be canceled, and the incident will be reported to the immigration office.
